BVEA Scholarship – essay required

Rotary Club of Ebensburg Scholarship – essay required

As a service organization, The Rotary Club of Ebensburg will continue its tradition of providing a scholarship to the graduating senior who plans on attending a technical school, trade school, or college or university. This candidate must be an outstanding and deserving individual and have demonstrated his/her abilities and commitment to service through the following selection criteria:

- List of all community/service activities involved in during their tenure at their high school.
- Possess good personal character and leadership
- > Displays cooperation, friendship, kindness and service towards his/her classmates.
- If possible, the student must not be receiving any other scholarship sponsored by attending high school.
- > The Blacklick Valley scholarship committee is responsible for the selection of the recipient.

Amount of Award = 1 @ 500

<u>Paul and Genevieve Palko Memorial Scholarship – essay required</u>

Paul and Genevieve Palko raised a family of nine here in the valley. Paul worked in the Blacklick Valley School District as a teacher, athletic director, and administrator while Gen was busy raising the family. Together they believed hard work, dedication to community service, faith in religion, and devotion to each other was instilled through family and education. Their children were given the opportunity of furthering their education whether by vocational certificates, associate, bachelor, or master degrees. They believed all students should have an opportunity to grow and develop themselves, as they will become leaders of the future.

This scholarship is open to Blacklick Valley seniors planning to further their education at a university, college, technical or trade school. The \$750 scholarship will be administered through the students first two semesters; \$400 in the first semester and

- \$350 in the second semester provided the student's first semester cumulative grade point average is a minimum of 2.5
- > Students applying for this award should submit an essay outlining their leadership qualities either in or out of school along with any service to the community.
- > The finance committee of the scholarship is responsible for the selection of the recipient.

Amount of Award = 1 @ \$750

Donald Kerekes Memorial Scholarship – essay required

Donald Kerekes was a 1959 graduate of Nanty Glo High School. Although Don had no children of his own, he had a positive and lasting impact on his community, serving as treasurer of Vintondale Borough and Vintondale Fireman's Club for many years. He had a significant impact on his family, devoting time and love to his mother, six siblings, thirteen nieces and nephews, and multiple grandnieces and grandnephews. The word that most Nanty Glo and Vintondale who knew Don used to describe him is friend. A classmate remembered him saying "He was a great dancer, especially the jitterbug". The scholarship is presented to a graduating senior who has displayed cooperation, friendship, caring, and assistance toward others.

- This scholarship is open to Blacklick Valley seniors planning to further their education at a university, college, technical or trade school in Pennsylvania.
- > Student must be involved in extracurricular activities and/or community service activities and demonstrate qualities of a well-rounded student of the community.
- > Student should submit an essay of at least 500 words stating why the individual believes they are deserving of the scholarship. The essay should include why you chose the field of study, and the college/university/trade school you have decided to attend. The essay should also include a description of involvement in community service, specifically how they made a difference in another person's life.
- > The scholarship recipient will be determined by a non-biased judging organization that has been established by the family of Donald Kerekes.
- > If possible, the scholarship will be awarded to a student who has not received any other Blacklick Valley scholarships.
- Essays will be scored based on the following criteria: originality (40 points), content (30 points), and storytelling (30 points). The scholarship is non-renewable, and it can only be used for expenses related to education.

Ryan and Cory Byich Memorial Scholarship – essay required

Donald The Ryan and Cory Byich Memorial Scholarship is open to any student, male or female, who is a member of any type of athletic sport.

Requirements: Students should submit an essay that includes why you feel you should win or deserve the scholarship. It should also include future plans, including a college you may be committed to and/or career field you will be entering. Should include why you choose that school or career path. Please include all extracurricular actives and/or community services

and/or offices held now and previously. You should discuss how these activities or community service work impacted your future and what you took away from it.

Ryley's Reason Memorial Scholarship – essay required

We are seeking applications from outstanding Blacklick Valley seniors who aspire to continue their education at a university, college, technical, or trade school.

To be considered for this esteemed scholarship, applicants must submit an essay of no less than 500 words, exploring the profound impact of mental health throughout their academic journey and its influence on their post-high school plans.

The selection process will be conducted by an impartial judging panel appointed by the Ryley's Reason Foundation, ensuring fairness and integrity throughout. Preference may be given to candidates who have not been awarded any other scholarships from the Blacklick Valley community, if feasible.

Essays will be evaluated based on criteria including originality (40 points), content (30 points), and storytelling ability (30 points). It's worth noting that the scholarship is non-renewable and can only be utilized for educational expenses.
